Love Offering



Each year the churches of the Minnesota Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church take a love offering during the month of June to support our common missions. It is all brought together on the first day of Annual Conference (Tuesday, June 20 this year). This year's offering will go to three missions:

- United Methodist University of Sierra Leone Sixty percent of the offering will go to help establish a new School of Applied Health Sciences in the city of Bo, adjacent to United Methodist-affiliated Mercy Hospital. Sierra Leone has one of the lowest life expectancies in the world, and one in five children die before their fifth birthday. This project will train midwives, nurses, community health officers, and technicians to help address the nation's acute shortage of health care professionals.
- Emma Norton Services in the Twin Cities will receive thirty percent of the offering, honoring a pioneer in services to women. The Residence houses fifty women in transition at any given time, and Emma's Place houses thirteen families permanently. Support services include case management, peer and individual support programs, youth programs, life skills and out-of-poverty training, mental health support, and advocacy for women with disabilities. Through Emma Norton Services, women and families overcome poverty, mental illness, and chemical dependency.
- Volunteers in Mission will receive ten percent of the offering, creating scholarships for first-time participants to try this vital and life-changing mission experience. VIM's pay their own way to serve up to two-week long terms domestically and abroad in mission projects, gaining a new perspective on the world and deepening in faith. Most Minnesota VIM teams engage in hands-on infrastructure projects to ensure that nutritional, medical and educational programs in developing countries become locally run and sustainable.
