

HOLY COMMUNION

#1 Ralph Waldo Emerson said

“what you do speaks so loudly, I cannot hear what you are saying.” Jung declared “You are what you do, not what you say you will do”

#2 Jane Austen, in *Sense and Sensibility*, wrote

“It isn’t what we say or think that defines us, but what we do.”

These re-state James; “be doers of the word and not merely hearers”.

#3 At this table, we’re grateful Jesus did not simply teach the disciples or the crowds with his words, but in an Upper Room, he acted.
